Chapter 1

Introduction

In the freedom movement of India, youths of the nation showed their active and selfless involvement. After independence of India the education system was overhauled. In the year 1969, on the occasion of the birth centenary Mahatma Gandhi, the father of Nation, the National Service Scheme was introduced with a view of energy and vigor of the youth may be utilized for building of strong and healthy Nation. 'The Nation building activities must center on the youth force was the central idea of the policy makers initially, as the youth have all the necessary potential and capabilities. To perform this National task, the youth personality has to be molded through community services which will help to bridge the gap between the villages and cities and will strengthen the social bonding. The motto of NSS is 'Not for Me, But for You'. which indicates selfless work of NSS volunteer for the upliftment of common and needful people of the society. The NSS activities were launched to create the leadership qualities in the youth to mold his personality for social upliftment. The trained youth will work at masse level and to will create awareness among the people about health, hygiene, healthy environment, social sanitation, scientific awareness, sensitizing the people about social evils like drug abuse, dowry system overuse of chemical pesticides & fertilizers, watershed management, construction of roads etc. The NSS also aimed at correcting the ills of rapid urbanization and need for rehabilitating villages. Thus, NSS is the most popular activity in the youth. Voluntarily every one donates blood to the needy patients. Awareness regarding small scale manufacturing units based on local resources, entrepreneurship, blood donation activities, social problems like HIV/AIDS, polio, cancer, tuberculosis, malaria, cholera is needed among the deprived people especially in rural region. To make this activity more fruitful NSS has made significant contribution along with spreading awareness against female feticide which seriously distorted the sex ratio in our population. Population and pollution are the main problems in the developing world. To control population NSS has taken lot of efforts regarding family planning through poster, slogans rallies & publishing articles in the newspaper. In the current age, use of media technology is most powerful tool to spread messages among the public for creating social awareness. Through the plantation NSS has took active part to avoid deforestation. For clean environment tree plantation becomes effective. Healthy society is the basic need of our Nation, keeping in view this aspect, annual

special camps are organized on the theme 'Youth for Healthy Society, Healthy Nation' in the slum area or adopted villages. There are many types of dissension in the family members; through counseling NSS volunteers got lot of success to demolish dissension. Through science and technology, sophisticated and high quality machineries, tools are developed but their proper use for the benefit of society was a problem. NSS has solved this problem to some extent through changing the mindset of the society. It is observed that daily number of accidents occurs on the road, to control this NSS is working for creating awareness among the society through road safety camps to reduce the accidents on the road. In collaboration with election department camps were organized to register newly eligible voters. During the period of assembly election NSS took a lead in conducting programs for conferment of all eligible voters. Knowledge of creating awareness about disaster management and how to face disaster is gained through Disaster management programs. it reflects that most of the volunteers have got opportunity to help govt. in the various disaster event. Skill of financial awareness, saving of money, develops ideal personality among the society. Participation of volunteers in the National & State level republic day parade is very important event to create nationality among them. Volunteers have unique and noble opportunity for participation in the National and State level camps like AVHAN (State Level Disaster Management Preparedness Camp) ', Utkarsha (State level Social Cultural Competitions) 'Prerana' , Youth Adventure Camps which are helpful for National integration. NSS plays very important role for national integrity. Present status of students shows that the involvement of volunteers in NSS are from all sections of the society.NSS tries to bring students from higher income group for social work, so it removes gap between all types of economically categorical students. It is aptly said that youths are the pillars of Nation. Future of Nation depends on youth only. Through NSS responsible and well cultured citizens are developed. The manpower with highest integrity for the development of nation is the main output of NSS.

Chapter 2

Aims & Objectives of the Study

2.1 Aim of the Study

"A Statistical Analysis and Evaluation of Performance of National Service Scheme Activities in colleges affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded."

2.2 Objectives of Study:

The objectives of the study were as follows:

- Critical evaluation of the NSS Community services undertaken through regular & special camping programme
- To statistically analyze the social impact of NSS community Service Scheme.
- To identify those NSS activities which have been proved effectively, this will be judged on the basis of the responses of the target group of the society.
- To study the attitudinal changes in the NSS functionaries like District Coordinators, Principals, Program officers, NSS Volunteers & Community Persons.
- To identify the best practices adopted by NSS various units for popularizing the NSS among the members of the grass root levels of the society.

2.3 Scope and limitations of the study:

The Maharashtra state has 275350 lakh volunteers in 24 Universities and Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University Nanded has 15000 volunteers of 198 Units spread from Nanded, Parbhani, Hingoli & Latur districts under the jurisdiction of Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University Nanded. Present study is limited to the jurisdiction area of SRTMU Nanded. The proposed study was based on randomly selected 10 colleges from each district running the NSS programmes regularly with annual special camping. The PO who completed nearer tenure and volunteers who are actively participate in NSS activities with completion of at least one annual special camp are considered in this study.

Chapter 3

Research Methodology

Research methodology the most important tool for successful completion allotted or assigned research project is adopted to complete research in systematic way. Research methodology is essential and unavoidable part of research irrespective of types. There are various methods such as experimental, historical, survey, observations, Delphi etc. Survey method was used in the present project and questionnaire was followed as a tool for collection of data. Investigator also used interviews of respondents as he personally visited.

3.1 Research Question:

Performance of National Service Scheme Activities in colleges affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathwada University, Nanded is evaluated through questioners related to NSS activities.

3.2 Hypothesis of the study:

• It was hypothesized that there was significant impact of NSS Activities on Community Development in the Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathawada University Area

3.3 Sampling Technique:

A list of all colleges affiliated to Swami Ramanand Teerth Marathawada University Area was obtained from university. All colleges were divided according to districts in four categories:

- 1. Colleges of Nanded district.
- 2. Colleges of Hingoli district.
- 3. Colleges of Latur district..
- 4. Colleges of Parbhani district.

For enrolling the colleges in study stratified sampling technique was used. Colleges were divided in above mentioned four strata. From these strata using random sampling colleges were selected.

From these selected colleges of the four strata, the questionnaire was filled from one Principal, randomly selected one NSS Programme Officer & ten randomly selected NSS volunteers.

Five community person were randomly selected related to colleges of the present study who are involved in the NSS activities of the colleges.

- . Some of the standard tools adopted in data collection used -
- 1) Randomly selected 10 colleges from each district: 40 Colleges
- 2) 10-15 randomly volunteers from each selected college: 500 Volunteers
- 3) Programme officers from selected colleges: 40 Programme officers
- 4) Principal from selected colleges: 40 Principal

5) District Coordinators/Area Coordinators and persons related to NSS from various parts of the society: 140 persons.

3.4 Data Collection Method:

It is based on personal interview on the responses of the stake holders through questionnaires. The proposed study also sought responses of people not directly involved in NSS in college activities.

Each participant i.e. Principal, NSS Programme officer, NSS Volunteers & Community Person or Social worker was explained in detail the purpose and method of study. The written consent from all the community persons who were interviewed was from each of the college & participant and then individual interview was conducted in separate places. Adequate time was given in between the questions for the participants to think, understand and answer accordingly. Findings of clinical examination and clinical history were recorded in the given specific format. The Proforma used for data collection and the overall master data formats are attached in annexure.

3.5 Statistical Data Analysis:

The collected data was compiled in EXCEL sheet and Master sheet was prepared. For analysis of this data SPSS (Statistical Software for social Sciences) software version 20th was used. Qualitative data is represented in form frequencies & percentages. For Qualitative data to test the association between two attributes chi-square test statistics is applied. Tabulated values were checked at 5% level of significance. Quantitative variables represented in form of mean & Standard deviation etc.

The hypothesis used are

- 1. Ho: There is no association between the NSS Regular activity favorably impact on the volunteers & usefulness of NSS in the social development.
- 2. H_o: There is no association between village respond to NSS programme during the NSS annual special camp & usefulness in the social development.
- 3. H_o: There is no association between spreading computer literacy in the community & usefulness of NSS in the social development.
- 4. H_o: There is no association between support of local NGO's for organizing the NSS activities & usefulness of NSS for the social development.
- 5. H_o: There is no association between NSS activities & impact made for small saving groups in the adopted villages.
- 6. H_o: There is no association between NSS activities & usefulness for maintaining the family relations.

Chapter 4

Data Analysis, Interpretation & Results

4.1: Observation & Results for Principal

A sample of 40 Principals was considered from the four districts covered by the SRTMU Nanded. Maximum number of male Principals was found in the study i.e. 37(92.50%) & female Principals were only 3(07.50%).

Out of 40 Principals covered under study Maximum number of Principals 21(52.5%) were in the age group 50-60 years and minimum number of principals 03(7.5%) in the age group 30-40 years.

About faculty it was observed that maximum 26 (65%) Principals were come from the Arts faculty. 12(30.0%) Principals from Science stream & only 2(5%) were noticed came from the Commerce faculty.

Investigator wish to state that the experienced Principals would be better in position to guide the volunteers, Programme Officers. Advisory Committee is formed in the college level for National Service Scheme activities.

The working experiences of Principals with National Service Scheme are an important indicator of attitude of the Principals towards the NSS activities. 23(57.5%) data presented almost Principals were the present study had the worked experience with NSS while 17(42.5%) Principals did not ever work with NSS. Out of the 40 Principals selected in the study 2(5.0%) Principals received the experience as a PO, 3(7.5%) had the experience as an Area coordinator. Only one principal worked as a Programme coordinator at university level & one worked as a District coordinator. A total of 40 Principals were considered in the present study 19(47.50%) Principals attended training programmes of NSS in their career. Out of them 16 (84.2%) principals feel that the training programmes of NSS found helpful in college administration & ensures effective student participation.

The role of Principal is very important for effective implementation of the NSS activities. NSS unit means the strength of NSS volunteers allotted by the NSS Department of the University at college level. The Principal of the college is main authority of the NSS unit. The role of principal is to guide & motivate the Programme Officer to implement the NSS activities for the college development as well as the community development. He is also responsible to give the facilities to the different departments for proper functioning. So it is important that approach of principal is more important..

A sample of 40 Principals was considered from the four districts of SRTMU Nanded. Almost 36(90%) Principals were setup the NSS office in their college .Only 4(10%) not setup the NSS office in the college.

The funds for implementation of NSS activities are released by the Central Government to State government. Then state governments release the same to the Universities. The Universities release the same to the colleges for the implementation of the

NSS activities. Out of 40 principals covered under study 26(65%) were of the opinion that the grants are not available in time for the NSS activities. In the study it was found that 5(35.7%) colleges makes provision of budget from the college fund and 7(50.0%) colleges arrange budget for NSS through their society. Only one principal provide the fund for these activities.26(65%) Principals has stated that they are getting the grants (funds) in time. For the smooth functioning of the NSS activities under the presidentship of Principal every college has constituted advisory committee The successes of NSS activities is mostly depend on the cooperation of college Principal. Almost all (100%) the Principals were constituted Advisory Committee in their colleges. According to 39(95.0%) Principals feels that the advisory committee's role was proactive while remaining 1(5.0%) did not feel proactive..

it was observed that (100%) principals visited to the NSS camp for monitoring and evaluating the activities.

The main objective of NSS is to develop student's overall personality through community service. The NSS volunteers are the main beneficiaries of the National service Scheme activities. The Principal is the chairman of the NSS Advisory Committee at the college level so the role of Principal is important in planning & implementation of the various activities. The Principals views are very important about the impact of NSS on the NSS volunteers. 95.0% of principal thinks that NSS special camps have helped to create necessary awareness in the villagers and 5.0% of principal thinks that NSS camps not helps to create necessary awareness in the villagers. 90.0% of principals think that many of the NGO & Government offices AREconnected with their colleges due to NSS..

Almost all (100%) Principals have stated that NSS was useful for the overall development of the student's personality. 95% of principals implemented "Novel" programme etc. under the NSS Activities. All principals feel that NSS activities also help the college administration for smooth functioning of the college.

In the present study according to 87.5% Principals felt that students requested to conduct the novel NSS activities while 12.5% students did not requested to conduct the novel NSS activities. The Maximum principals i.e.32 (80%) from the selected colleges felt that the NSS volunteers did not create any type of critical problem in the college. According to Some Principals i.e. 8(20%) volunteers were created critical problem in college campus. Majority of the principals i.e 95% felt that NSS is an useful platform to bridge gap between the college and the society

NSS Volunteers are the main beneficiaries of the NSS the programme by way of the development of his perception about community, his skill to perform certain jobs and to develop in him the qualities of the leadership and became an organizer and administrator to attain the multi faceted development of his personality as a whole. NSS volunteers is the main part of the NSS activities so that the impact of NSS on him was considered here in the perspective of NSS PO's.

In the present study almost all 40 (100.00%) of selected college Programme Officers considered that the NSS regular activities made favorable impacts on the NSS student volunteers i.e. NSS activities are useful for the overall development of the student's personality.

Community is the group of the people in the particular city, locality in the village adopted for the community service. It includes all individuals, students, parents, institutions etc. the community provides NSS volunteers the first hand knowledge of living conditions of masses and thus processes of mutual learning get started. Impact of NSS on villages was considered here in the perspective of NSS PO's. Almost 36(90.0%) PO's feel that villages favorably respond to the NSS programmes during the NSS camps and 4(10.0%) feel that villagers do not respond favorably to the NSS camp.

The NSS attainted one of the objectives in the perspective of the PO's. If the villagers and the town people are come closer to each other than it is beneficial for the society development.

About 32 (80%) PO's think that NSS activities spread computer literacy in the community while 8 (20%) PO's feel that NSS activity did not helped to spread the computer literacy in the community.

Out of total of 40 Programme officers almost 36(90.00%) feels that the students had taken the initiatives in proposing the NSS activities while 4(10.00%) did not feels like that.

Around 39(97.50%) of the Programme Officers were covered under the study. Opinion about Cleanliness drive are useful for the social development. 40(100%) of the Programme Officers were covered under the study opinion that the tree plantation programmes are useful for the social development.

The NSS programmes were made the desired impact on the society. 34(85%) Programme officers opinioned that Drug Abuse Awareness Program made significant impact on the society. Out of 40 respondents 35(87.50%) have stated that awareness of Anti-Dowry programme made the desired consciousness in the society.

Female feticide & Watershed Management are burning topics in the current scenario. Now a days the ratio of the male female in the society is decreasing so that there is need to make the effective awareness so that society can realize and necessary steps could be taken in time to balance the male female ratio. NSS unit is implementing the awareness programmes for this purpose. 33(82.50%) Programme officers have opinioned that the female feticide awareness program made positive impact on the community for the social development. Regarding almost 38(95.00%) PO's feels that Watershed Management awareness is useful for the development of the Nation.

Out of total 37(92.50%) respondents were opinions that social superstitions awareness program was useful for the community. 39 (97.50%) respondents mentioned that the Blood Donation awareness camps are useful for the social development.

All the PO's were feels that the Pulse Polio abhiyan, AIDS Awareness & Survey of children not enrolled in the school etc. Programs are benefitted to the society & made desired impact on the social development. In the Present study the Maximum 33 (82.50%) PO's felts that the Save Energy Awareness &Road safety Awareness Program made the desired impact on the society. 33(82.50%) PO's opinioned that Construction of Roads & 34(85.00%) PO's said Organ Donation Programs also made desired impact on the people.

A total of 40 PO's were considered in the present study out of that 33(82.50%) respondents were considered that Road safety Awareness Program made desired impact on the people.38(95%) PO' involved in the survey of children's not enrolled in the school..

The PO's views are more important about the usefulness of NSS because he is the person who executes the NSS activities at the ground level .

Out of 40 Programme Officers covered under the study 35(87.50%) PO's express their opinion that the NSS activities narrowed the gap between the villagers and the town people. 33(82.50%) PO's revealed that NSS has helped in removing the gender inequality. 38(95%) PO's were considered that NSS has helped them to learnt for the proper utilization of the funds. According to 2(05%) PO's were revealed that the NSS not helped them to learnt proper utilization of funds.

The planning of work is more important before the work has been started. 37(93%) PO's considered that they learnt the planning of the work before it started. 39(97.50%) PO's considered that they learnt the auditing of NSS expenditure.

NSS unit are conducts many activities for the rural and the community development. The objective of the National Service scheme is that to bring the community people in the process of the nation building through the development. NSS was organized the computer literacy awareness program for the rural people. 39(97.50%) PO's opinioned that the NSS activities benefitted to the society while 1(2.50%) did not agree with this. 38(95%) have felt that NSS has helped in creating the necessary awareness for the voting performance in general elections in the democratic country.

In the present study 32(80%) & 36(90%) PO's feels that NSS activities helped in ensuring social justice like Gender, Privileged & under Privileged respectively. NSS is organizing the various camps to create the awareness among the people which helps the community for the development. 33(82.5%) PO's opinions that NSS has helped in promoting the awareness about the family planning work & maintain social harmony in the family relations among the public. 7(17.50%) did not agree that NSS is helps for promoting the family planning works & maintain harmony in the family relations programme. 33(82.5%) PO's opinion that NSS is effective for preparing small saving groups.

Out of all respondents 33(82.5%) respondents were considered that NSS activities made noticeable mark on social development & these have significantly helped in the Disaster Management while 7(17.50%) did not considered such benefits. 39(97.50%) PO's opinioned period of regular activities is sufficient.

The Programme officer is the most important person in the education system & NSS. He is the medium between the volunteers and the society. He performs many roles in the NSS like organizer, coordinator, supervisor, educator, supervisor etc. The PO's perspective is very important in the evaluation of the impact NSS activities on the community development.

In this research out of 40 Programme Officers 37(92.5%) were found that usefulness of NSS in the social development & 3(7.5%) were found that the NSS not useful for the social development. Maximum PO's Perspectives NSS is most important activity for the development of the society. So in this research try to find the association between the PO's view about the impact of NSS regular activities on the volunteers and usefulness of NSS for society development. Out of 37, all 37(100%) were found the NSS regular activity made favorably impact on the student volunteers and usefulness of NSS in the social development. And none were found that the NSS regular activity did not made favorably impacts on the student volunteers but NSS activity is useful for the development of the society. Three PO's View that NSS regular activity were did not made favorably impact on the student volunteers & NSS activity is not useful for the social development. Only one PO's views that NSS did not made any impact on student & it was not useful for the social development. There is a significant association between the NSS regular activity favorably impacts on the student volunteers of NSS and usefulness of NSS in social development.

Out of 40 Programme Officers of colleges 39(97.5%) were found usefulness of NSS in the social development. Out of that 37(91.90%) Programme Officers were think that NSS activities made significant impact on the village where as 2(66.70%) were think that NSS activities not made significant impact on villages but this activity is useful for the social development. All these Programme Officers 1 PO's view that NSS activities did not made significant impact on village & it was not useful for the social development. There is a significant association between the PO's view i.e. NSS activities had made significant impact on villages and his belief related to the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

In the present study 36(90.0%) Programme Officers were found villagers favorable responds to the NSS programmes during the NSS camp while 4(10.0%) did not feels such

help. Programme Officers 37(92.50%) were found that usefulness of NSS in the social development & 2(5.0%) were found that the NSS not useful for the social development. Out of that 34(91.90%) PO's were feels that villagers favorable respond to the NSS activities during the NSS camp was useful for the social development. 3(8.10%) PO's were feels that villagers respond to NSS during the camp but it was not useful in the development of the society. Some PO's Officers (3) feels that villagers respond during the NSS camp was not usefulness of NSS in the social development. NSS had made significant impact on villagers and his belief related to the usefulness of NSS in the social development. It is observed that the villagers have favorable respond to the NSS programme during the NSS camp.

Similarly according to the NSS PO's perspectives they got good support from the local NGO's in organizing the NSS activities & 33(89.20%) out of 35 feels that the support of NGO were usefulness of NSS in the social development, 6(16.20%) feels that they did not get good support from the NGO but their view was it usefulness of NSS in the social development & so on. There is no proper significantly association between the support of local NGO's for organizing the NSS activities & useful of NSS in the social development.

Similarly out of 32 NSS programme Officers 31(83.80%) feels that NSS activities spread the computer literacy in the community & which very usefulness of NSS in the social development. 8 (20.0%) feels that NSS did not spread the computer literacy in the community & not usefulness of NSS in social development. According to 1 PO's perspectives NSS activities spread the computer literacy in community but which was not usefulness of NSS in the social development. There were significant statistical associations between the NSS activities spread computer literacy in the community & usefulness of NSS in the social development *i.e.* NSS had made a significant impact in spreading awareness about computer literacy in the community and usefulness of NSS in social development.

Out of 37, 36(97.3%) Programme officer's expressed their opinion that the special camp in the adopted villages was useful in the development of the village & it was useful for the society development. Out of 3(100%) PO's which are said that NSS is not useful for the social development all 2(66.70%) PO's feel that special camp was useful for the development of village but it was not useful for the social development. 2(75%) PO's were revealed that special camp in the adopted village is not useful for the development of village as well as society. There is significant association between the PO's views and the annual special camps in the villages are useful in the development of village & usefulness of NSS in the social development. NSS activities had made significant impact on villages and his belief related to the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

Out of 37, 36(97.30%) respondents were opinion that NSS activities have narrowed the gap between villagers and town people & it is Usefulness in the social development. There is significant association between the PO's view i.e. NSS activities narrowed the gap between the villagers and town people and his belief related to the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

It shows that most of the programme officers are unable to make proper utilization of funds. NSS helped to them for the proper utilization of funds and it was useful for the social development.

37(100%) PO's said that due to NSS they learnt about the planning of work. It is one of the most useful for the development of society. *There is significant association between the PO's views and planning of work made significant impact on the social development.*

37(100%) PO's revealed that NSS has helped in creating the necessary awareness for the voting in the general election in the country & it is useful for the social development. There is close association between the PO's view *i.e. NSS activities had made significant impact on creating the awareness for the voting in general elections and his belief related to the usefulness of NSS in the social development.*

Out of 37, 37 (100%) and 36(97.30%) PO's opinion that NSS activities helped in ensuring the social justice like Gender, Privileged & under Privileged respectively which is useful for the social development. There is a strong association exit between the PO's views i.e. NSS activities have helped in ensuring the social justice and his belief related to the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

Social camping activities organized by the National Service Scheme to achieve the objective of the NSS in the villages. The villagers are also involved in the innovative activities for their development. National Scheme is a voluntary basis scheme for the social development. NSS was implement the various activities in the villages so the impact of these activities is important in the perspective of CP's

In the present study 140 community persons were participated. Out of these 79(56.4%) CP's were like the camping programmes & 61(43.6%) were like the regular activities conducted by the National Service Scheme. 131 (93.6%) respondents were opinion that NSS activities effective for the disaster management & helpful for the society. Almost 137(97.9%) respondents were opinion that the NSS activities are useful for the creating the awareness in the society about the Co-education and family planning which was helpful for the social development while 3(2.1%) did not feel such that. Almost 128(91.4%) respondents revealed that NSS activities are the beneficial for the society & it is effective for maintaining the family relation.

Out of 140 respondents 116(82.9%) were considered that NSS is useful for the social justice like Gender and 104(74.3%) respondents opinion that it useful for the social justice like privileged & under privileged. NSS is useful for the creating the necessary awareness about social justice in the society. 130(92.9%) Community Persons concluded that NSS was impacted for the society for its development. 130 (92.9%) respondents revealed that National Service scheme is effective for the disaster management which is useful for the community development.

The participation of community peoples is very important in every stage while implementing NSS activity at adopted village, because the adopted villages are the social laboratory of the NSS. NSS can implement the some experimental pilot project in the adopted villages for the community development. So the Impact of the NSS on community person or villagers is very important which is directly related to the social development. In this research some association found between the views of community person selected from the colleges and usefulness of the NSS for the social development considered.

In present research, out of 140 selected community persons 130(92.86%) community persons were feels that the usefulness of NSS for the social development . 10(7.14%) did not feels that NSS was useful for the social development. Out of 130, total 122(93.85%) community persons were done the NSS meeting along with the NSS volunteers at the college level & they feels the usefulness of NSS in the social development. 09(90.0%) did not feel the attending the NSS meeting was useful for the social development. 09 (90.00%) Persons attainted in the NSS meeting at college & their view about meeting was not useful for the social development. 8(6.15%) persons not attended the NSS meeting at the college level & their views about NSS meeting at college level was not usefulness of NSS for the social development. There is significant association between community persons view i.e. attending the NSS meeting at college level along with NSS volunteers had made significant impact on the usefulness of the NSS for the social development and his belief related to the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

In this research according to the 127(87.5%) community persons the NSS camp was organized in their villages & according to 13 persons NSS camp was not organized in their village. Out of 140, community persons, 127 (87.5%) feels that the usefulness of the NSS for the Social development out of that 121 (393.8%) community persons were feels that NSS activities taken by the NSS volunteers in their village were the usefulness of NSS in the social development while 06(60%) persons found not agreed with this statement. According to the 09(6.92%) persons the NSS camp taken in their village but it was not usefulness of the NSS for the social development while according 04(40.0%) community persons NSS camp

was not taken the their village & it was found not usefulness of the NSS for the social development. There is significant association between community persons view, According to community persons view NSS activities taken by the NSS volunteers in their village had made significant impact on the usefulness of the NSS for the social development and his belief related to the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

In the resent study 111 (85.38%) community persons were feels that the student efforts are sufficient for the development of village & it was usefulness of NSS in the social development while 19(14.62%) community persons were did not feel that the student effort are sufficient but it was usefulness of NSS in the social development. 03 (30%) community persons feels that the student efforts were insufficient for the social development & it was not usefulness in the NSS for the social development. It shows significant results related to association between the community person's view in the student efforts and the usefulness in the NSS for the social development. The student efforts about NSS made significant impact on the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

Out of 130, 125(96.15%) CP's were considered that NSS camps make noticeable effects on the village which is useful for the social development. 01(10.0%) CP's feels that NSS camping did not make an effect on village but it was useful for the social development. Out of 130, 5 (3.85%) CP's considered that NSS camping did not make effects on the village development & it was not useful for the social development. In present study is observed significant results that the association between the community person's view in the effects of NSS camping on the villages and the usefulness in the NSS for the social development. The effect of camping on villages made significant impact on the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

In the present study 130(92.86%) Community person's said that NSS is useful for the development of society. Out of that 127(97.69%) CP's have stated that NSS is useful for the village to implement government scheme which is helpfulness in the social development. 03(2.31%) CP's feels that NSS is not useful for the village to implement government schemes but it was useful for the social development. 02(20.0%) CP's opinioned that NSS not useful for the Social development. Out of that 08(80.0%) CP's feels that NSS is not useful for implement government scheme & social development. There is significant results that there is a effective association between the community person's view in the effects of NSS for implementing the government schemes in the villages and the usefulness in the NSS for the social development. The effect of implementing the government scheme in villages made significant impact on the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

Out of 130 community persons, 123(94.61%) CP's were concluded that NSS volunteers help to peoples in emergency which useful for the society development.

07(5.38%) concluded that NSS volunteers help to peoples in emergency but it was not useful for the development of society. Out of 10 CPs, 01(10.0%) CP's considered that NSS volunteers not help people in emergency & it was not useful for the development of society. NSS is most useful for the society to help them in emergency. It's shows that there is significant association between the community person's view in the effects of NSS volunteers help the people in emergency and the usefulness in the NSS for the social development. The effect of NSS volunteers help the people in emergency made significant impact on the usefulness of NSS in the social development.

According to view of community people NSS activities are mostly like full and fruitful activities for the social development and awareness in the rural and urban area people.

The researcher has used various statistical soft wears, statistical tools for analysis of the data collected

Chapter 5

Summary/Findings:

5.1 Findings:

- Initially the NSS had started in the year 1969 on with an experimental basis and then
 after short time it has been widely accepted all over the country and became regular
 and essential supportive service programme in higher education.
- The benefits and utility of NSS has become a routine activity for the student & progrmme officers at almost all the Universities in India.
- In this research the impact of NSS activities in view of college principals, Programme
 Officers, volunteers & community persons were found for community development
 because they were the part of the community which directly & indirectly involved in
 the NSS activities.
- After participation in NSS the process of socialization has been transformed among the volunteers.
- Personality and various skills have been developed among the youths.
- NSS activities helped students to strengthen the social bond between college youth and society.
- Distance between rich, medium & economically poor student has been bridged out because of NSS activities.
- Basic objectives of NSS towards Nation building & National integration has been fulfilling because of NSS.
- NSS also helped to developed work culture among the youth.
- Thus, motto of NSS Not Me But You has been achieve a lot.
- In this study it is also observed that District coordinators, Area coordinators, Programme officers are not satisfied regarding honorarium, they have to go financial crises.
- In the study it is observed that Blood donation, AIDS awareness, disaster
 management, water shed management, cleanliness drive, remove gap between village
 and urban people through special camping program are few of the best practices
 identified by the various units of NSS for Popularizing the NSS among the members
 at grass root level of the society.

In present study statistically it shows all most all the results are significant.

- There is association between the NSS Regular activity favorably impact on the volunteers & usefulness of NSS in the social development.
- There is association between village respond to NSS programme during the NSS annual special camp & usefulness in the social development.
- There is association between spreading computer literacy in the community & usefulness of NSS in the social development.
- There is association between support of local NGO's for organizing the NSS activities& usefulness of NSS for the social development.
- There is association between NSS activities & impact made for small saving groups in the adopted villages.
- There is association between NSS activities & usefulness for maintaining the family relations.

5.2: Impact of NSS on the Community Development by Principal Perspective:

Various conclusions regarding Impact of NSS on the Community Development by Principal Perspective are presented in this section.

The experienced principals were use to guide the student and PO for conducting the NSS activities. Almost 26 (65%) principals were found that from the arts faculty. 24(60%) principals have worked with & the working experience with the NSS was useful for the executing the National Service Scheme activities at the college level for achieving the objectivities of NSS. 23(57.5%) Principals attended the training programme of NSS which was benefitted to make the positive attitude about the NSS. The principal's feels that the training programmes helped them in the college administration & it was also effective for ensuring the student participation.

Due to the limited funds the colleges cannot do concrete work and they take up the small activities like cleanliness drive, tree plantations etc. Most of the Principals were not in favor of self financing unit. In such case the principals found that they have made the alternative adjustments for the funds like College fund, Society fund & public. 39 (97.50%) principals were of opinions that the role of advisory committee was proactive about the National Service Scheme which was directly or indirectly helps in development of society.

Almost all the principals perspective that the National Service Scheme was useful for the overall development of the student's personality & it was useful for the developing the skills in the students. So the principal perspective was National service Scheme made the significant impact on the student's personality which helps the community development. The objective of NSS is to create the social awareness in the students by involving them in various activities. According to the entire principal's covered under study National Service Scheme activities creates the necessary awareness in the students i.e. It was help to create the social awareness in the students. The noticeable impact made by NSS activities for creating the social awareness in the student which useful for the nation development.

Role of the Principal is that to make the coordination between the students and staff for achieving the objectives of the education. Almost entire Principals revealed that the NSS helped them in administration for the smooth functioning of the college. All Principals were considered that the National Service Scheme was useful platform to bridge the gap between the college and society. Due to NSS college students got the opportunity to work with the community people & understanding the issues communities. The National Service scheme was used to bring closer the college student and society which needs for development of society.

In the present study all principals' perspectives towards National Service Scheme was useful for keeping the college campus Clean & plastic free zone. The National Service Scheme made the noticeable impact on the college students, staff & society for creating the awareness about the cleanliness and save the natural resources which helps to the social development. Almost 32(80%) Principals were revealed that NSS volunteers did not created any problem in the college campus & all NSS volunteers were requested to conduct the novel activities. According to Principals perspective these activities were helps to create the interest in the students to participate and conduct the novel programmes for the social development.

In the villages or slums National Service Scheme was conducted various activities by involving the college students. The Principal perspectives the NSS special camps were useful to create the necessary awareness in the villagers. National Service Scheme was used to create the awareness regarding the health and environment, social behavior, Importance of Education & the general awareness in the villagers. According to them NSS was medium for the society development.

In the Present study according to the principals perspectives NSS activities were useful make the social awareness in the student which helps the overall development of students & it also helps in improving the NAAC score. Almost 39(97.50%) Principals revealed that NSS was

played the important role in the disaster management. Due to NSS the volunteers were help during the situations when earthquake happened, chicken guniya was rampant and during the other situation like fire problem etc.

5.3 :Impact of NSS on the Community Development by PO's Perspective:

Various conclusions regarding Impact of NSS on the Community Development by PO's Perspective are presented in this section.

Programme Officers 38 (95.0%) were revealed that the due to NSS students taken initiatives in proposing the NSS activities. NSS was made favorable impact on the student thinking about the social issues & problems. The positive attitude was increased in the student about the community problems which helps for the development of himself and the community.

The funds or grants are more important for the implementing the NSS activities. 21 (52.50%) PO's revealed that funds are not timely available for the organizing the NSS activities. 27(67.5%) PO's were revealed that the funds are insufficient to organize the NSS programmes. PO's interest was only in conducting the activities as formalities. The negative approach of the PO was harmful for the National Service Scheme.

As per NSS Programme officers perspective NSS activities were made a favorable impact on the students. NSS activities were help to the volunteers to develop their qualities of the leadership, skills & personality development.

According to the NSS programme officer's perspectives the NSS activities made favorable impact on the society for creating the social awareness in the society which helped for the community development. The NSS programmes like cleanness drive, tree plantation, drug abuse, anti dowry made desired impact on the society.

Due to NSS community could understood the impact of the cleanness drive & sanitation of the village. It because of the NSS the community people had done the proper sanitation in their villages.

NSS help to create the awareness in the society about female feticide so that the rate of the female foeticide decreased at considerable level. The government motivates the NSS in implementing the awareness activities.

NSS also helps to create the importance of the Blood Donation in the student and community so the numbers of blood donation persons were increased. The PO's Perspectives

Pulse Polio abhiyan conducted by the NSS has helped for the community to create the healthy nation & social development.

In India the most of the population is young people and the AIDS or HIV is one of the issues in the rural area or the slums. The NSS was conducting the various awareness programmes about the AIDS/HIV for the society. The impact of these awareness programs was that the number of persons infected by these diseases is goes on decreasing or at least they are aware with this.

Out of total sample Programme officers, 38(95%) were revealed that the save energy awareness programs made the noticeable impact on the villages or the community which helps for the development of the villages. 37(92.50%) PO's were opinion that the soft skill programs are useful for the student in their future life i.e. they are aware with their skills and use these skills for their family development which helps for the nation building. 32(80.0%) PO's opinion that due to NSS activities were help to increase the sense of the gender equality among the people and the volunteers. 39(97.5%) PO's were said that the NSS activities help to learn the proper utilization of the funds. NSS activities were helps to learn the auditing of the expenditure. The NSS activities were made the noticeable impact according to mentioned activity which helps the students, PO's & community developments.

Now a day's NSS is implement the innovative ideas like computer literacy etc 32(80.0%) PO's opinion that due to NSS activities increase the awareness about the computer literacy in the community which helps to connect the rural community to urban community. All PO's were opinion that the NSS activities are benefitted to the society for their development. Out of total sample Programme officers, 36(90%) PO's revealed that NSS activities help for increase the sense about social justice about privileged & under privileged among the society people. 33(82.50%) PO's were opinion that NSS helped in organizing the small saving groups in the village and these groups are involved in the village development.

NSS activities helps to create the necessary awareness about the family planning & it helps to increase the harmony in the family relations among the people. NSS activities made the noticeable impact on the social development & these significantly helped in the Disaster Management

5.4: Impact of NSS on the Community Development by NSS Volunteers Perspective:

Various conclusions regarding Impact of NSS on the Community Development by NSS Volunteers Perspective are presented in this section. The NSS is implementing the various activities for the development of the students. The almost 494(98.8%) students were participate in the regular programmes & 472(94.4%) were actively participate in camping programmes. The impact of these activities was the student aware with the issues of the societies and increases the sense about the socio-economic problems in the community. They understood the importance of the various activities conducted by the scheme & their interest about the social development was increased.

484 (96.8%) Volunteers were said that the activities implemented by the scheme are very useful for their personality development of students and also helps to achieves one of the objective of this scheme. According Due to NSS the students were develop their skills which helps them in the future life. The impact of these activities on the students is the people perceive the NSS volunteers differently than the other students.

NSS implement the various activities related to the development of the village. According to the 454(90.8%) volunteers activities are useful for the National Integration. The National Service Scheme helps in the National Integration & development of the villages. 432(86.4%) volunteers said that due to these activities increase in the collective thinking of the villagers which helps for the development of their village.

The NSS students were involved in the various activities and programmes according to the possibilities and opportunities created by the college NSS units. According to the NSS volunteers the activities related to the environment & social conscience like Cleanliness Drive, Tree Plantations, Watershed Management, Save Energy Awareness, Drug Abuse, Anti-Dowry, Female Feticide, Mental superstitions etc. were made the noticeable impact on the community and due to these activities increase the awareness in the people. Almost

469(93.8%) volunteers were feels that due the Cleanliness Drive people understand the importance of cleanliness. The community people works repairs the drainages, construct of toilet, cleaning of the public water tank, well &other water resources.

The NSS activities are helpful for the spread of the message about the tree plantation in the community & the effect of this the community people start the tree plantations for protect the environment. 394(78.8%) volunteers have said that the Drug-Abuse programmes increase the necessary awareness in the rural youth & these people avoid the Drug-Abuse. 399(79.8%) volunteers considers the Anti-Dowry programmes create a sense in the youth about the Dowry.

404(81.4%) NSS volunteers opinions that due to the NSS activities the rate of female feticide was decreased & the awareness about this was increased in the society. The NSS is helpful to increase the awareness about the watershed management in the rural areas the impact of these programmes the people adopt the activities like water harvesting. The peoples save the natural sources of the water.

The National Service Scheme helps to increase the awareness in the society about the health related issues like importance of Blood Donation, Pulse Polio abhiyan, AIDS awareness, Organ Donation & other Immunization Programmes. All these activities made a favorable impact on students, youth & community at large.

The student volunteers have stated that NSS created more awareness among the rural community regarding the natural sources of the energy and influenced the people to make use of such energy in their day-today life.

456(91.2%) of students feel that NSS activities helps in arriving at proper decision in their life. selecting i.e. life partner, choosing a career, etc. 440(88.0%) volunteers have put their opinion that the NSS activities were helped in made any mark on social development.

5.5: Impact of NSS on the Community Development by Community Peoples Perspective:

Various conclusions regarding Impact of NSS on the Community Development by CP's Perspective are presented in this section.

131(93.6%) CP's have revealed that they participate in the NSS meeting along with the NSS volunteers at college level. The participation in such type of meeting was useful to understand the objectives of the National Service Scheme.

127(90.7%) CP's were said that the NSS activities taken by the volunteers in their villages are effective for the development of the villagers. It is found that the people accepts the awareness programs like cleanliness drive, Tree plantation, save energy, female feticides, Health awareness camp, Water shed Managements etc. 131(93.6%) CP's were revealed that they were participated in the NSS activities which made the noticeable impact on the villages. According to the 118(84.3%) CP's the NSS volunteer's efforts are sufficient to develop the village.

Regarding the social impact on the community, it was observed that community people are organized and their sense of cooperation is increased. They removed the misunderstanding within the groups. People are solving their problems at the local level. The role of cultural programs organized by the NSS volunteers is important. The cultural programs have increased the awareness about the burning issues in the society like female feticide, Gender inequality etc. 113(80.7%) CP's were revealed that the NSS volunteers help the people in the emergency. Due to the NSS activities a sense of helping nature was increased in the society people.

Out of 140 respondents 116(82.9%) considers that NSS is useful for the social justice like Gender and 104(74.3%) respondents opinion that it useful for the social justice like privileged & under privileged. NSS is useful for the creating the necessary awareness about social justice in the society. 130(92.9%) Community Persons concluded that NSS made

impact in the society for its development. 130 (92.9%) respondents revealed that National Service scheme is effective for the disaster management which is useful for the community development.

It was found the due the NSS the community has increased cohesive association and misunderstanding about each other has been minimized. It was also found that the awareness about the social justice like gender, privilege & under privilege is increased in the community people. A sense of gender equality has increased and the scientific attitude has been developed among them and their discussion with officers and school teachers has become more positive.

CP's have stated that NSS helps to create the sense about the family panning in the community. It was found that people understood the small family norms and marriage of the female individuals took place at the proper age as per medical and legal aspects. 128(91.4%) CP's were said that due to the NSS harmony increased in their family relations & it was helpful to maintain the family relations.

It was found that the community participation in the programmes is essential because the NSS unit implementing the community activities or projects with the help of community people. All the community persons feel that National Service Scheme is effective for the disaster managements and the social development.

Chapter-6

Recommendation

Based on the data analysis and interpretations investigator has suggested some recommendations which are as follows:

- 1. Constructive Interaction between the Social workers and the NSS volunteers is essential for the achievement of the objectives of NSS.
- 2. The lectures and the project conducted by the NSS unit should be extended for creating awareness regarding current social problems among the volunteers.
- 3. The participation of SC and ST category NSS volunteers & Programme officers should be increased. There should be compulsory quota for these category and motivate them to take active part in the NSS activities.
- 4. Girls volunteers in the college needs motivation to increase their participation in NSS.
- 5. Strength of female staff Programme Officers is very small, it is essential to increase it.
- 6. Most of the PO's are from the Arts faculty. It is essential to counsel and motivate other faculty teachers to participate in NSS.
- 7. More weightage should be given to NSS certificate holder for the NSS certificate at the time of admission for higher education & employment for NSS volunteers.
- 8. Senior citizen must be involved in the NSS programmes for motivation of the NSS volunteers and the community people.
- 9. The Orientation Programs should be taken in first week of each month for the NSS volunteers and output of activities must be discussed. This will be helpful to increase the success and effectiveness of NSS. Activities.
- 10. Schedule of annual planning meetings of NSS to be conducted in the beginning of the academic year.
- 11. PO should know the Specific and clear guidelines for the implementation of programmes.

- 12. While appointing programme officer, preference should be given to those who are having interest in the social work & helpful nature towards students and society.
- 13. There should be strong interaction between the villagers and the colleges after selecting village for camping. During period of camping villagers are expected to provide all type of support to the volunteers for completion of camp.
- 14. Most of the activities must be conducted in collaboration of different NGO's and govt. agencies, so that the student will get information regarding the functioning of the NGO's for the social development and how they can help root level people in the society.
- 15. Annual special camps should be organized after consultation with local people of village, keeping in view basic need of this area understanding need of local community of village.
- 16. The eminent social workers, community persons, government authorities must be invited in the planning and execution of NSS activities.
- 17. Official support and moral favorable attitude of college authorities is necessary for smooth functioning.
- 18. Orientation programems for NSS volunteers should be conducted in detail and proper planning of NSS activities is essential for it.
- 19. There is need to increase fund of NSS and this fund should be released from university in time so that colleges perform activities as per the pre-decided schedule without hampering other activities.
- 20. Students, PO's & Community persons should be motivated to participate in the National Service Scheme and to encourage the programme officer special incentives must be given to them for their valuable contribution in NSS.
- 21. Evaluation of the NSS programme should be carried out at regular intervals.
- 22. There is need to increase honorarium of NSS functionaries like PO,DC,AC etc. enable them to work smoothly without financial crunches.
